Fighting Scots Play Non-Conference Game at UPJ

EDINBORO, PA – Edinboro will take a break from the PSAC West wars to play its final non-conference game. The Fighting Scots face a strong Pitt-Johnstown team that like Edinboro has lost its last two games.

The Fighting Scots have been a streaky team all year, with a four-game winning streak and a pair of three-game streaks. Conversely, they have had one three-game losing skid and four two-game stretches. It has all added up to a 12-11 ledger.

Pitt-Johnstown had won five straight contests before suffering recent losses to California(Pa.) and Ashland. The Lady Cats come in with a 15-6 record, but are 11-1 at the UPJ Sports Center, the lone loss a 74-60 setback to Cal.

Oddly enough, Edinboro has a two-game winning streak at UPJ, capturing the championship of the UPJ Lady Mountain Cat Classic in 2003 and 2004. The Fighting Scots also won last year's meeting between the two, 55-49, at McComb Fieldhouse.

This marks the sixth road game in the last eight games for Edinboro. That may be a good thing, however, as the Fighting Scots are just 4-7 at home and 8-4 away from McComb Fieldhouse.

Kelly Calderone leads the Fighting Scots, averaging 18.2 ppg. The senior guard

has moved into sixth place in career scoring with 1,365 points.

She adds 5.0 rpg. and has a team-high 101 assists and 61 steals. In addition, she is shooting 85.1 percent from the free throw line (137 of 161), and needs to make two more free throws to break the school record for career free throws made. She has 399, with Jessica Rowe holding the record with 400.

Freshmen **Samantha Reimer** and **Kelsey Conklin** rank two-three in scoring at Edinboro at 13.0 ppg. and 12.0 ppg., respectively. Conklin also leads the Scots in rebounding at 7.7 per game. Reimer has scored 300 points this season, the most by a freshman since Rowe's 394 in 1996-97.

The Fighting Scots also hope to get another strong effort from **Rae Sherred**, who scored a career-high 20 points at Slippery Rock. The 5'9" junior is averaging 9.0 ppg.

Rachel Johnson, a junior forward, adds 7.6 ppg. and 5.7 rpg., while shooting 54.6 percent from the floor.

UPJ features a trio of double-figure scorers, led by Allison Krischer. Krischer, a 5'7" senior, is averaging 19.2 ppg. and has made 46 of 132 three-pointers. She also leads the

Lady Cats in assists (101) and steals (65).

She's ably supported by Jessica Zapf, a 5'11" senior who averages 17.9 ppg. and a team-leading 8.9 rpg. Zapf is shooting 57.6 percent from the floor and has made 109 of 142 free throws (76.8 percent).

Kricscher and Zapf are both 1,000-point scorers. Zapf enters the game ranked 19th in career scoring with 1,182 points and is sixth in career rebounds with 797. Kricscher is 22nd in career scoring with 1,108 career points.

The third player in double digits is Lindsay Cale, a 5'10" sophomore who averages 10.5 ppg.

The contest also features two coaches who have combined for 874 career wins. UPJ's Jodi Gault is in her 25th season and has 534 career wins. Edinboro's Stan Swank has won 340 games during his 20-year tenure.

Following the Pitt-Johnstown game, Edinboro resumes PSAC West action with a key league tilt against Lock Haven on Saturday, February 17.

The Last Time Out Indiana(Pa.) 78, Edinboro 66

The Fighting Scots committed 27 turnovers which led to 29 points for the Crimson Hawks. Kelsey Conklin led four players in double figures with 20 points, adding 7 rebounds.

Rae Rae Comes Up Big Big

Junior **Rae Sherrad** was one of the few bright spots in the 52-43 loss at Slippery Rock. The 5'9" guard accounted for 20 of Edinboro's 43 points. The 20 points were a career-high. She made 4 of 10 three-pointers and was a perfect 8-for-8 from the line.

Calderone Named PSAC West Player of the Week for Second Time

Kelly Calderone was recognized as the PSAC West Player of the Week for the period ending February 4. It marked the second time this year the senior guard has earned the honor. She led the Fighting Scots to a 3-0 record, including road wins at Clarion and Shippensburg. In between Edinboro snapped a 13-game losing streak to California(Pa.). Calderone averaged 21.7 ppg. during the period, including a 26-point effort against Cal. She scored the winning basket with 30 seconds remaining in the 55-50 win at Clarion.

Boro Puts an End to Heiges Field House Jinx

Shippensburg's Heiges Field House has always been a difficult place for Edinboro to pick up a win. That's why the 65-53 win over the Lady Raiders was that much more impressive. Not only were the Lady Raiders 7-2 at home entering the game, but Edinboro had won just once in the previous 17 meetings. Now you can make it twice, and actually the Fighting Scots have now won two of their last four games at Shippensburg.

Kim Patrols the Middle

Shippensburg's Shanna Oaddams has given Edinboro fits in previous meetings. Head coach Stan Swank may have found the equalizer last Saturday. **Kim Mardis**, a 6'3" sophomore, came up with the best game of her career while helping to hold Oaddams to just 3-for-12 from the floor. Mardis came off the bench to play 12 minutes, and finished with a career-high 7 blocks to go with 4 rebounds. The 7 blocks also tied the school record previously set by Agnieszka Michalow last year.

Scots Snap Long Losing Streak to Vulcans

It was a long time coming, but it was worth it. Edinboro snapped a 13-game losing streak to California(Pa.) last Wednesday with a 77-58 win over the Vulcans. The Fighting Scots had not defeated Cal since the 2000-01 campaign.

Calderone Striking at the Line Again

Earlier in the year **Kelly Calderone's** had a streak of 46 consecutive free throws made. The senior guard is shooting 86.8 percent for

the season, and she is at it again from the charity stripe. She had a streak of 28 consecutive free throws come to an end recently at Lock Haven. Her last miss had come late in the Cheyney game, a span of six games.

Conklin Named PSAC West Rookie of the Week

Freshman **Kelsey Conklin** was named the PSAC West Rookie of the Week for her performance in three games two weeks ago. The 6'1" forward averaged 20.0 ppg. and 8.3 rpg. in losses to Shippensburg and Mansfield and a win at Bloomsburg. She opened the week with a career-best 27 points, half of Edinboro's point total of 55 points. Conklin added 12 rebounds. Then came a 23-point, 11-rebound effort at Mansfield, her fifth double-double of the season. Saddled with foul trouble, she only played 22 minutes at Bloomsburg, but still contributed 10 points. Conklin shot 60.0 percent from the floor (24 of 40) and 73.3 percent from the line (11 of 15).

Calderone Named to Edinboro Classic, Avalon Classic All-Tourney Teams, Plus PSAC Player of the Week

Despite the fact Edinboro lost both of its games in the Edinboro Classic, **Kelly Calderone** was chosen the PSAC West Player of the Week. In addition, the senior guard was named to the All-Tournament Team. Calderone opened the tourney with a 21-point effort against seventh-ranked Glenville State, adding 8 rebounds, 6 steals and 4 assists. She then matched her career-high with 32 points against West Liberty, making 13 of 23 field goals. With 19 points in an 86-84 loss to West Liberty, and 19 more in a 63-51 win over Central State, she was also named to the Avalon Classic All-Tournament Team. She added 12 assists and 4 steals.

Calderone Joins 1,000-Point Club

Kelly Calderone became the 22nd member of the 1,000-point club thanks to a career-high 32 points against Charleston(WV). That gave the 5'7" senior, who is in her third year at Edinboro after transferring from Buffalo, 1,011 points. She has since moved up to eighth place in career scoring with 1,329 points, the latest jump coming after a 26-point effort vs. California(Pa.) on Wednesday.

Johnson, Sherred Post Career-Highs vs. Kutztown

Edinboro's 77-68 win over Kutztown was spearheaded by a pair of Fighting Scots who posted career-highs. **Rachel Johnson**, a junior forward, paced the Fighting Scots with 22 points. She made 8 of 11 field goals and 5 of 5 free throws. **Rae Sherred** added 19 points, as the junior guard made 4 of 11 three-pointers.

Heiar Leaves Team

Lacey Heiar came to Edinboro this fall as a junior college transfer from Williston State. She was expected to make an immediate impact as the replacement for departed All-American point guard Callie Iorvido, but she saw limited playing time as the season progressed. Heiar left the team following the win over Central State. She saw limited action in all seven games, scoring 13 points, although 11 of those came in the loss to West Liberty State.

Freshmen Making Their Marks

Head coach Stan Svank entered the 2006-07 campaign excited about his recruiting class. At the same time, he has usually gradually broken in his freshmen. That has not been the case this year. First-year players **Samantha Reimer** and **Kelsey Conklin** both earned starting roles in the preseason. Reimer dropped in 25 points, 21 in the sec-

ond half, in her first career game against Goldey-Beacom. The 5'7" guard is averaging 13.3 ppg. and scored in double figures in the first eight games before being limited to five points against Kutztown. She had 17 points, 4 assists and 4 steals at Lock Haven, along with going 10 of 15 from the line. Conklin, meanwhile, is averaging 12.3 ppg. and 7.5 rpg. At 6'1", she seems to have a natural knack for rebounding, an Edinboro weakness in recent years. She pulled down 20 boards vs. Charleston(WV). She has had five double-doubles. Against Lock Haven, she contributed 15 points, 7 rebounds and 6 steals.

Calderone, Michalow Rank Among 2005-06 Division II Leaders

Kelly Calderone and **Agnieszka Michalow** ranked among the NCAA leaders in 2005-06. Calderone set a school record for free throw percentage, making 145 of 165 for 87.9 percent. That was good for tenth in Division II. Michalow, meanwhile, broke the school record for blocked shots, swatting away 81 shots. That was good for 14th nationally.

Calderone Free Throw Streak Comes to End - Part One

Kelly Calderone's streak of consecutive free throws made finally came to an end against Charleston(WV). The senior guard entered the year having made her last 32 free throw attempts to end the 2005-06 campaign, and began the year with an 8-for-8 performance against Goldey-Beacom. She did not go to the free throw line in the win over UNC Pembroke. She made her first six in the upset of 14th-ranked Charleston(WV) to bring the streak to 46 consecutive free throws made before finally missing. The 46 consecutive free throws made is a school record.

Sherred Wins NCAA Sportsmanship Award

Rae Sherred was a huge part of Edinboro's playoff run a year ago, but it was her reaction to an embarrassing moment that really displays the type of individual she is. With the score tied at 59-59 in the PSAC Championship game against California(Pa.) last March, the junior guard came up with a steal with seven seconds left. While being tied up, she called time out, but the Fighting Scots were out of time outs and were assessed a technical foul. The Vulcans proceeded to make four free throws over the final seven seconds for a 63-59 win. Heatbroken afterwards, Sherred bravely faced the attending media at the postgame press conference. Her courage would earn her the NCAA Sportsmanship Award this past summer.
